



For Prospective Employers and Supervisors

The Pharmacy Peer Health Assistance Diversion Program at Peer Assistance Services (PAS) provides comprehensive services to pharmacists and interns who may be experiencing physical, emotional, psychological, substance use/abuse problems or other personal issues. We work with pharmacists and interns in order to ensure safety to practice and support them in rehabilitation through monitoring.

At Peer Assistance Services we believe:

- Monitoring leads to the safe pharmacy practice:
 - Our pharmacists and interns prove safety to practice by following a comprehensive Rehabilitation Contract which may include: random drug/alcohol testing, attendance at 12 Step Meetings, attendance at Peer Support Groups, work place supervision, and participation in ongoing treatment and therapy.
- Monitoring leads to a successful career in pharmacy:
 - Our pharmacists and interns regularly receive praise from employers and supervisors for being productive, efficient, and dedicated to the practice of pharmacy.
 - Our pharmacists and interns have overcome obstacles and receive support in order to be successful in their rehabilitation and in their pharmacy careers.

Why hiring a PAS pharmacist or intern is a safe option:

- PAS provides safeguards for employers through random drug/alcohol testing and practice restrictions such as working excessive hours and working for more than one employer.
- Our case managers are in regular contact with treatment providers and are notified if there is any risk to a pharmacist's or intern's practice. We immediately notify employers if it is determined a pharmacist or intern is unsafe to practice.
- PAS encourages pharmacists and interns to join professional organizations, review academic pharmacy journals, and participate in continuing education credits.
